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Dear Friends,

The NGOs in Lebanon have been very much the active government, helping the nation to stand on its feet, helping Lebanon to survive. The unfortunate and tragic flow of catastrophes don't seem to have an ending.

Lebanon has been grappling with an economic and financial meltdown, the COVID-19 pandemic, the consequences of the Beirut Port blast and the continued impact of the Syrian crisis since 2019. The social impact of the crisis is catastrophic, as the poverty rate in Lebanon doubled from 42 per cent in 2019 to 82 % of the total population in 2021, with nearly 4 million people currently living in multidimensional poverty. This situation, compounded with the currency depreciation and severe inflation, have hit Lebanese households very strongly, limiting purchasing power, access to healthcare and education. Consequently, the majority of the families living in Lebanon cannot afford to meet their basic needs or those of their children.

Adamant to our vision, "working together to inspire, aspire and sustain a healthy community", Ahla Fawda has been on the ground to see things through. We have helped in the rebuilding of Beirut, in creating jobs, in providing food and shelter, in medical care and general support to individuals and families. We are also working on environmental and sustainable projects to support our community. We are all individually, and as a whole, deeply affected by what is happening and living the pain of the nation. We continue to abide by our mission, "to stand with those affected by hardship, providing essential support, empowering talents, and instilling positive change."

As 2021 ends, we cannot move on without sending our supporters, donors, and friends our sincere 'thank you'. We would like to share a moment of reflection, to look back at this year and what Ahla Fawda has achieved as an organization dedicated to helping its community through these extreme, difficult times. **Our community is the why we do what we do, but YOU are the how**

First of all, here's a little background!

In 2006, Ahla Fawda's founder, Imane Assaf, would organize Halloween events from her home for the neighborhood children. The families, friends and community began to look forward to these events. Hence, a group of moms, created a public Halloween parade in 2013 on Hamra Street, the proceeds of which were allocated to an environmental project, transforming a trash filled area into a small green space. Considering the success of the initiative, they were encouraged to register as an NGO to curate cultural events & projects on an annual basis to uplift the streets of Beirut and support the local economy. At that first event, even though the streets were closed and there was police attendance for security, more people arrived than was anticipated. This created a chaotic atmosphere. It was chaos, but a beautiful chaos, which was how the name "Ahla Fawda" came to be.

Ahla Fawda carried on with these events and its humanitarian mission to underprivileged communities for the following years, until the revolution of 2019. At that critical moment, Ahla Fawda started to prioritize humanitarian support. For Ahla Fawda, a brighter Lebanon begins with a sustainable approach from the people, starting from the environment, up to the support of small businesses and growing talents within the country.

Today, Ahla Fawda is led by a core team who have organized projects all over Lebanon, working organically and on the ground with the people. Ahla Fawda's objective is to support people in need through responsible, sustainable and eco-friendly projects and initiatives. To work towards positively engaging our beneficiaries in reducing negative environmental impact. To raise awareness and spread joy.

Ahla Fawda's main objective in all its projects, initiatives, and campaigns, is to support vulnerable people. Our concern first and foremost is to seek, assist, and promote human welfare. Ahla Fawda aims to ensure that its community meets the basic human needs of food, health, medical support and shelter. Our distribution center, "Hamra Bella", is supplied with food parcels, clothes, shoes, and home goods. This year we have registered a record in distribution benefiting over 16,520 beneficiaries!

Our focus in 2021 also included support in terms of tuition fees and school supplies.



Beneficiaries call our Hotline and register for food parcels, clothes, hygiene products, diapers & baby milk. Our new initiative includes an exchange of eight clean, recyclable domestic waste (plastics, cans, glass...) for any of the above items. This combines our Humanitarian and Environmental efforts in one, injects a mindset of no waste, and allows a sustainable solution to continue providing food parcels.

Our Humanitarian operation has extended to include full medical care to our beneficiaries, a new initiative that began in August of 2021, after the explosion in Akkar. We have partnered with other NGOs to put together all donated medicines in one HUB, one inventory list, and distribute to those in need. This allows for a larger registry of medicines, bigger area of distribution, and more people reached.

We have asked our registered beneficiaries for an exchange of services; food and other in return for recyclables!

This initiative provides the beneficiaries with a positive mindset to recycle (give & you shall receive), minimize waste (use & reuse), and allows Ahla Fawda a way to sustain its services (receive & give back).

Part of the community engagement that Ahla Fawda takes part in is the cleaning of shared spaces, shorelines, beaches, and streets. Communities and volunteers are encouraged to participate in these activities in an effort to raise awareness & help preserve the surroundings. Partnering with Bahr Bala Plastic, sponsored by the EU, in a countrywide clean-up of the shoreline of Lebanon, Ahla Fawda adopted the Saint Simon beach area in Ghobairy. Our approach was to motivate the local community of fishermen to clean their beach on a regular basis in exchange for the repair of their boats, a football field for the youth, recyclable bins for the community and regular supply of essential needs in food and other. It is an ongoing beach clean-up, creating a new routine & changing mindsets of people.





With Clean Beirut, a collaborative project with Al Makased School, AUB **Neighborhood Initiative** & other partners, we scraped and cleaned the walls, turned them into artwork wherever it was feasible, involving students from schools to turn public bins into artwork as a community service.









The pandemic and economic crisis have almost destroyed the cultural aspect of the country. Ahla Fawda has always played a role in encouraging cultural events. This year we were involved in various activities that brought life back to the streets, such as parades, supporting the street art scene, scraping the walls of the city for artwork, and revamping bins.


